### Progress across the school (44 children)

Expected progress for the year is 3 points. Across the school, the small number of children eligible for Pupil Premium Funding exceeded this and made good progress in line with non-PPG children (figure in Brackets).

### 2015 Key Stage 2 results (9 children)

At Key Stage 2 the attainment of children eligible for Pupil Premium Funding exceeded that of National figures, considerably so for Reading and Writing. These figures remain below the non-PPG average figures of the school. However, the very small numbers hides the wide variation in individual attainment and achievement.
